Goddess of the East:

presides over personal renewal, fertility and fruitfulness. A sign of Rebirth, and Resurrection; She is also the Maiden aspect of the Three-fold Goddess.

The Full Moon

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The Hare:

is a symbol for the moon and purity. The Hare is not only associated with the Moon, the Sacred Fire and Spring, but also with the dawn and more importantly with enlightenment.

The Hare was at one time considered both male and female. To produce the cosmos, both must be present. the hare has links to the mysterious Otherworld of the supernatural.

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The Egg

is not only Potential, but it also represents the Cosmos, the very ground of Being from which we spring—

In many traditions the egg is a symbol for the whole universe. The 'cosmic' egg contains a balance of male and female, light and dark, in the egg yolk and egg white. The golden orb of the yolk represents the Sun God enfolded by the White Goddess, perfect balance, so it is particularly appropriate to Ostara and the Spring Equinox when all is in balance for just a moment, although the underlying energy is one of growth and expansion.

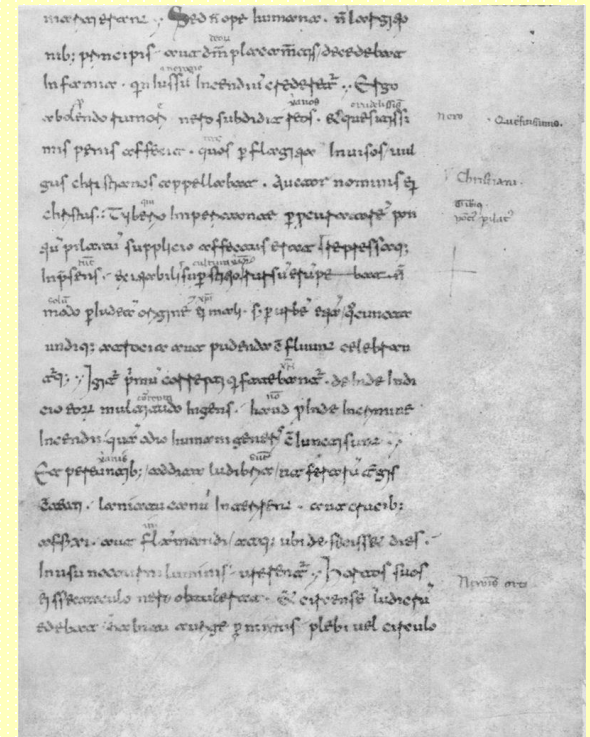

His Gift to Advancing Our Ability to Expand Our Vibration

“Consequently, to get rid of the report, Nero fastened the guilt and inflicted the most exquisite tortures on a class hated for their abominations, called Christians by the populace. Christus, from whom the name had its origin, suffered the extreme penalty during the reign of Tiberius at the hands of one of our procurators, Pontius Pilatus, and a most mischievous superstition, thus checked for the moment, again broke out not only in Judæa, the first source of the evil, but even in Rome, where all things hideous and shameful from every part of the world find their centre and become popular. Accordingly, an arrest was first made of all who pleaded guilty; then, upon their information, an immense multitude was convicted, not so much of the crime of firing the city, as of hatred against mankind.”

It is from the Germanic frijaz meaning “Beloved, belonging to the loved ones, not in bondage, free”.

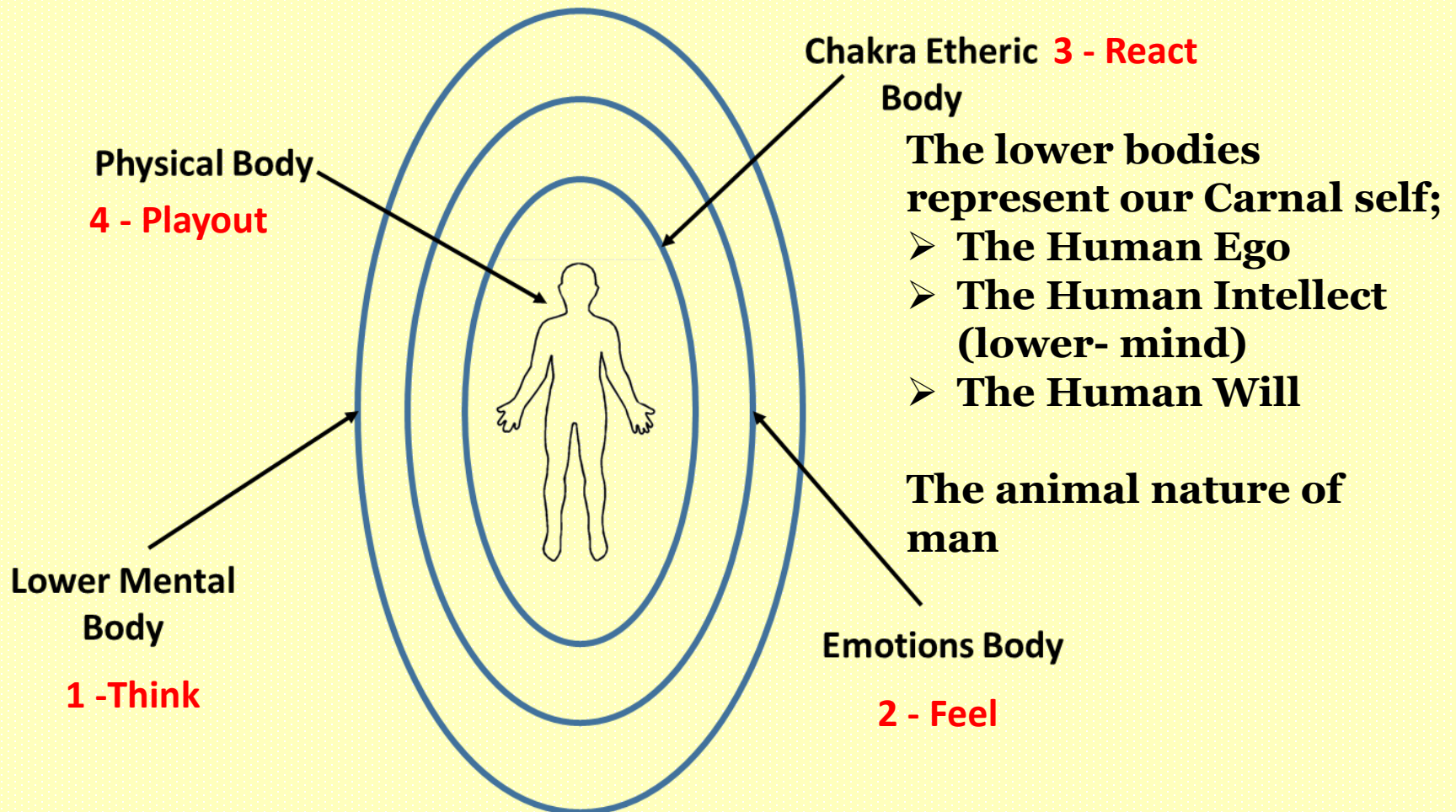
Frigg (Frigga) is the Teutonic goddess of clouds, the sky, and conjugal (married) love.

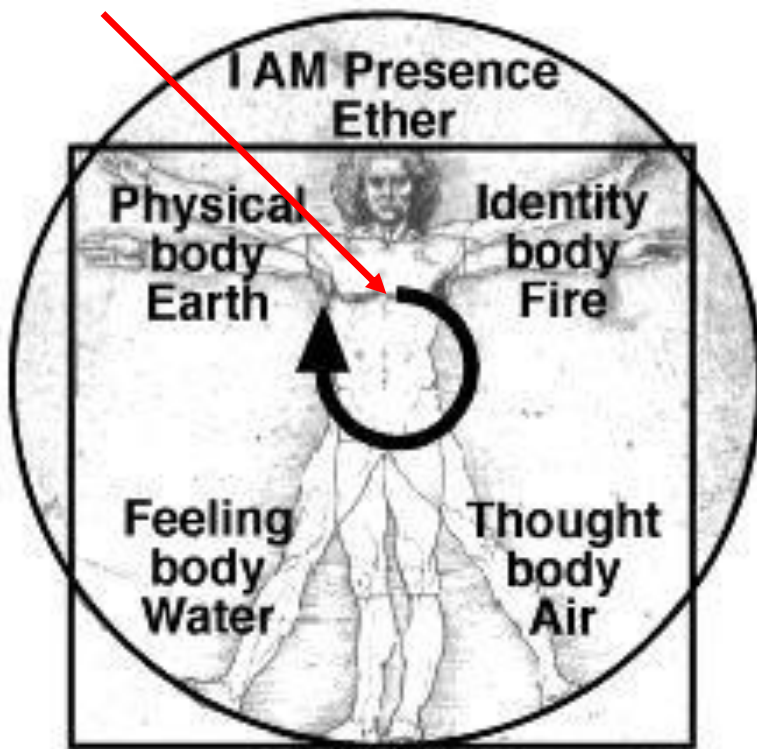

The square symbolizes the four basic elements

The Vitruvian Man by Leonardo Da Vinci

The square represents the material universe, created from the “squaring of the circle,” namely the process whereby Spirit becomes matter.

The Death Of Jesus Was Is Recorded At 3pm

This was symbolized by the veil in the temple being rent from top to bottom – a recorded fact in history – which again symbolized that man does not need an intermediary (Priest of any religion) to reconnect to the universe

Saturday is named after The Roman God – **Saturn**

Challah *refers to "dough" and specifies the special twisted loaf of bread eaten by Jews on Shabbat and other special occasions*



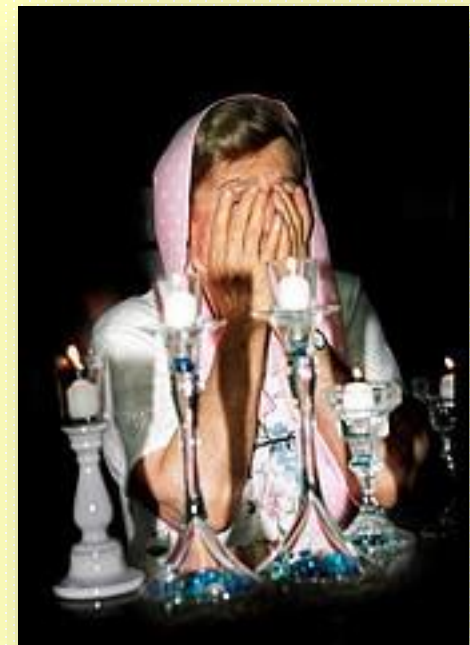

Shabbat Candles
